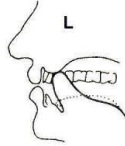


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LD and RD Words and Phrases

/r/ and /l/ are a *liquid* sounds that affect the consonants that are said next to them. For /r/, be aware of pulling the tongue back with considerable tension and, while you are not smiling as you say this sound, there is a little tension in the upper corners of the lips as if you were about to smile.

For /l/, remember to bring the tongue tip up to behind the front teeth. A slight smile will also help in the production of this sound

- Add a vowel to the end of the word in column 1 to ensure you are saying the /l/ or /r/
- Say the word in column 2 making sure you are still saying the /l/or/r/. STRETCH THE SOUND.
- Say the word in column 3 and make sure you are saying all the sounds. Say the word in a sentence, maintaining accuracy
- Add more samples of your own
